Year 7 Melbourne Zoo Excursion

Recently the entire Year 7 cohort made their way into Melbourne Zoo for a Science excursion on Animal Classification. In class groups, students answered a series of questions related to an animal of choice from each of the five classes of Kingdom Animalia. After a short lunch break, students eagerly set off, maps in hand, to take on the Group Classification Challenge. During this time, students were to find and name (both scientific and common) as many Australian species as possible. Students also took the challenge to learn about the conservation programs that are run by Zoos Victoria including Don't Palm Us Off, They're Calling On You and Wipe 4 Wildlife.

Well that is enough about what we did. Let's hear what the students thought and learnt:

"I learnt that the Zoo puts the animals in different parts to make it easier to find what you're looking for" – Chandler Weeks

"I learnt that the fish I studied uses its teeth to clean other sea animals" – Brooke Metcalfe

"I learnt that Gouldian Finches are endangered" – Katie Laukart

"One of the things I found interesting was that sting rays actually have a bit of wire in their tail called a barb and that's how it stings things / protects itself" – Bec Sinclair

"My favourite part of the zoo was the Lemur cage. I also liked walking in groups with our friends to answer all the questions" – Emily Myers.

The latest acquisition for the Rotary Makerspace is a set of Sphero balls. Sphero is a robotic ball that you control with a tilt, touch, or swing of your smartphone or tablet. They provide a platform for learning about coding, robotics and programming. The Sphero will be available for class and lunchtime use.


The library also has a new online catalogue which allows users to search for resources from home, class or anywhere there is internet. Students can access the catalogue via the favourites star on Compass and log in with their school username and password. Edrolo

The year 12 VCE students are fortunate enough to be participating in a free 8 week trial of an online VCE support program called Edrolo. This program offers support material in the form of video tutorials, quizzes, exam practice and immediate feedback for students and diagnostic data for teachers. Students will be able to use the program for revision purposes and teachers will set aspects as homework or to complement work done in class.

We are hoping that all students take advantage of the resources on offer and we will be seeking feedback at the end of the trial to determine the value of the program. So, if you have a child in Year 12 ask them about Edrolo or visit edrolo. com.au to see for yourself.
