Dear Parent

Warrandyte High School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Warrandyte High School's parent payment arrangements for 2021.

Please find the Parent Payment schedule for Year 10 attached.

Each year the School Council prepares a budget to provide resources for educational programs, administration, facilities maintenance and student/classroom resources. Parent payments are a vital contribution towards the various items and resources needed by our students to **learn** the standard curriculum.

The School Charges are made up of three categories of payment:

- **Essential Educational Items** are those items, activities or services that are essential to support student learning of the standard curriculum. These are items that the school considers essential for all students and which students take possession of. Parents may choose to provide the items themselves or buy the items from the school where practical and appropriate.
- **Optional Items** are those items, activities or services that are offered in addition to the standard curriculum program. These items and activities are designed to broaden the school experience for your child and are provided on a user-pays basis.
- **Voluntary Financial Contributions** You can make a general voluntary contribution that goes towards classroom requisites and all of our school's important priorities for 2021 as well as providing additional activities and services for all students. Additionally you can make a voluntary contribution to specific priorities.

Warrandyte High School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents.
